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A Message from Anne McLachlan, 2017 President of <u>BIAWE Board of Directors</u>

Together with the Board of Directors, I am pleased to be involved with the good work that our charitable non -profit organization does for individuals with a brain injury and their families. In 2017 we continued to focus on our strategic directions of: **Awareness, Programs & Services and Navigation.** Our work was supported through various fundraising efforts such as King of Guac and the Golf Tournament as well as in memoriam donations and grants. 2017 was a transition year for BIAWE as we searched for a replacement for our executive director. Thanks to Jeannette Ware-Mikhael who stepped in as interim executive director with technical support by Sarah Morris. Welcome to Anna Jurak who joined BIAWE as our executive director in October 2017. Thanks to the Board of Directors, Committee Members, Program Facilitators, Volunteers, and our community partners for their dedication & hard work. In addition, thank you to our generous sponsors who year after year continue to support our programs and activities.

Awareness:

- Through the "Helmets on Kids" program, we provided 105 helmets for children who would not otherwise be able to afford them. An anonymous donor funded the helmets for 2017-18.
- Thirty people attended the Brain Injury Awareness Ceremony held at the Butterfly Memorial in June 2017.
- Information about BIAWE programs was provided on our Website, Facebook and Twitter.
- The "Step Ahead" newsletter was published twice in 2017.
- The executive director & two board members attended the OBIA conference in November 2017. Nav Nagra & Kathy Worotny attended the quarterly OBIA advisory council meetings.

Programs & Services:

- GOALS groups were offered in Windsor and Essex County and were funded by a multi-year United Way grant. The Program co-ordinator is Amanda LaFrance. Facilitators were Renee Cantarutti, Kristina Jurkovic, & Elizabeth Bryant.
- We were awarded a Grant from the Chandisherry Foundation for 2016 & 2017 and received a WFCU Community Grant to fund the Quarterly Education series and Sports Concussion Workshop.
- Volunteers for various programs were co-ordinated by Victoria Obeid.
- The "You are Not Alone" Support Group continued on the second Tuesday of the month, facilitated by Sara DeLuca with average attendance of thirteen.
- A monthly Drop-in Social Group (averaged 9 people) on the fourth Monday at Hospice was led by Jeannette Ware-Mikhael at the same time as a Caregiver Group, facilitated by Sara DeLuca (averaged five people).
- Six social outings such as a Movie Night at Devonshire Mall, a picnic in the park, the Beyond Disability Fundraiser, and Holiday dinner at the Lumberjack were held, with average attendance of sixteen.
- The executive director Anna Jurak, took over co-ordination of the Peer Support Mentoring (an OBIA program) in October 2017.
- We held our 5th annual conference, "Implementing ONF Clinical Practice Guidelines for Moderate to Severe TBI" in June 2017 with 110 attendees.
- Three Education Sessions were provided for individuals with a brain injury in March, May and November 2017. In November 2017, 70 people attended the 7th annual workshop on Sports Concussion in Windsor.

Navigation:

- We have partnership linkages with OBIA, Chrysalis Day Club (ALSO), United Way of Windsor-Essex, Windsor-Essex Public Health Unit, GECDSB-Special Education Advisory Committee, Beyond Disabilities, Hospice, Multicultural Council, Canadian Mental Health Association, Victorian Order of Nurses (VON) Windsor Regional Hospital & Hotel Dieu Healthcare.
- Our Executive Director received an average of 12 calls per month from individuals with a brain injury, their caregivers and health care providers and provided them with information about available services in our community.
